Bradley Scott Spencer, 51, of Wichita Falls, TX was born February 12, 1970 and died at his home on Friday, May 9, 2021.

Brad was born in New Orleans, Louisiana and moved as an infant to Brisbane, Australia. At the age of 2, he moved to Fort Worth, TX and later to Denver, Colorado where he graduated from Overland High School in 1988. Following graduation, he joined the U.S. Navy stationed out of San Diego, California. He served in Operation Desert Storm in Kuwait and was discharged in August of 1991. He later served in the Texas National Guard. Brad worked for several years in east Texas as an EMT. He then attended the Tulsa Welding School and worked in home construction. He later worked in south Texas in the oil and gas industry.

Brad was preceded in death by his mother, Lynn Spencer of Longview, TX, and by his brother, Dr. Bart Spencer of Wichita Falls, TX.

He is survived by his father and stepmother, Phil and Dee Spencer of Bella Vista, AR, and by his sister and brother-in-law, Lisa and Tyler Romine of The Colony, TX. He also leaves 4 nieces and nephews.

Brad will be buried in a private service at Soules Chapel Cemetery near Gilmer, TX. Arrangements are under the direction of McWhorter Funeral Home.
