It is with love and heavy hearts that we announce the passing of Janice Marie Ward Davis of Gilmer, Texas, on September 14, 2024, at the age of 65 years. She was born on November 6, 1958, to Herman Arleigh and Edith Ozell Harris Ward. She married her best friend, Coy Eugene "Gene" Davis, on December 28, 1984. This year marks 40 years of their life together. Janice and Gene have one daughter, Brittany Ann Davis Gowin, and son in law, Randy Gowin. Janice loved the outdoors. From her beautiful flower gardens spanning the majority of her two-acre homestead, to the Azalea Trails of Tyler, to the Dallas Arboretum, to the many road trips looking at Texas Bluebonnets and Indian Paintbrushes, and to the many fall road trips taken to see the multicolored foliage. She loved to travel with her husband, but refused to step foot on an airplane. So whether it was Salt Lake City, Utah in the winter; Santa Fe, New Mexico in the summer; Pigeon Forge, Tennessee in the fall, or a hundred places in between, she and Gene enjoyed life on the road. In 2009, she became a journeyman electrician for Davis Electric, and spent each day side by side her husband. When she wasn't working with Gene, she was on Pinterest. From cross stitch, to baking, to various creative holiday crafts, Janice enjoyed creating items that brought joy into the world. She loved hosting parties--whether it was for individuals or large groups, she loved using her crafty talents to bring people together for good. Known as "Little Miss Sunshine" to many, she was always willing to volunteer to bring happiness into the lives of others. When it came to touching someone's soul, Janice

always seemed to know when a word or gesture of comfort was needed. Janice was a devout member of The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints and was baptized on November 22, 1966. She and Gene were sealed for time and all eternity in the Dallas, Texas temple on April 10, 1993. Throughout her years of service in the church she held many callings of which she served vigilantly. She loved hosting group celebrations for the Primary, Young Women, Relief Society, Young Single Adults, and Couples activities. 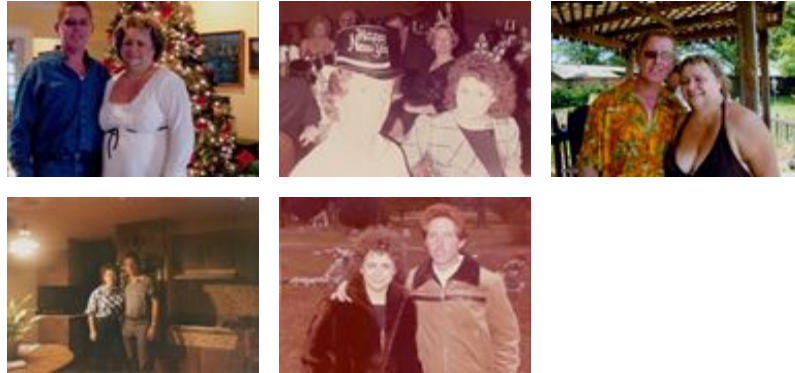
