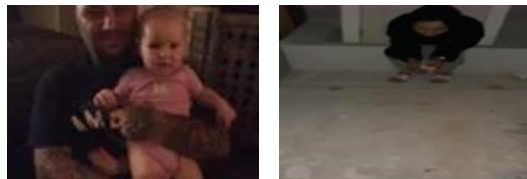
He was preceded in death by his mother, Nancy Jean Wallace; and brother, Bryan Atchley.

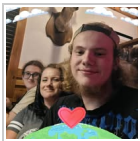
