



Norman Lavaughn Finch

July 13, 1938 - April 21, 2024

Norman Lavaughn Finch, known as 'Bubba' to his family, was born July 13, 1938 in Gilmer, Texas. He was preceded in death by his parents L.J. "Jay" and Florence Finch.

He is survived by his faithful and dedicated wife of 63 years, Mable Finch. He also leaves to mourn Carrie Gentry, a dedicated and caring daughter; Maylea Andrews, an adored granddaughter; and Tru Serenity Haynes, a treasured great-granddaughter.

Norman was educated in the Piedmont Elementary and Junior High School system and graduated from Valley View High School. Norman's education laid the foundation for a life of service and kindness. Norman served the Tyler Pipe community for over four decades before he retired, exemplifying a strong work ethic and integrity. He was also a passionate and skilled rancher in the Upshur County area.

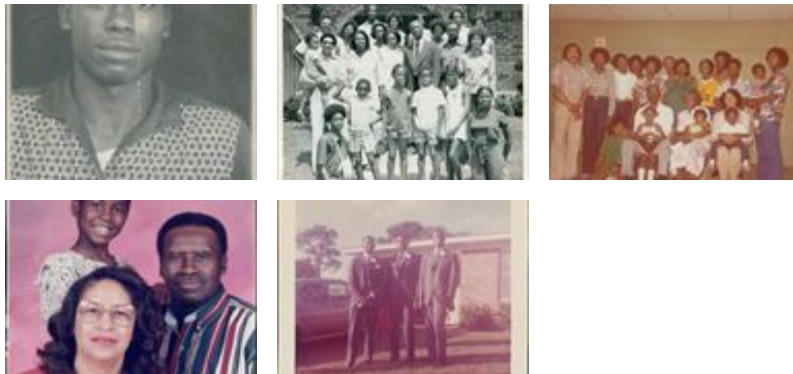
