Love Itself, impeccable daughter, sister, wife, mother, grandmother, aunt, friend and faithful servant of the Lord, passed away on the first day of spring, a time of rebirth and new beginnings, March 20, 2017 in Longview, Texas with her children by her side. She is survived by countless people who know how to live and love because of her example. She was born in Kelsey, Texas on May 26, 1923. She was 93.

Viola was always a welcoming, accepting and nonjudgmental person. She deeply loved her family and constantly gave to and served them from a place of love. Viola hand-made each grandchild a baby blanket, blankets that were so cherished and well-loved that they became tattered beyond recognition. The people who were influenced and shaped by her quiet, unassuming life are innumerable. She inspired others with how easily and fully she accepted people, made them feel seen, loved and understood.

Mrs. Barksdale is preceded in death by her eternal sweetheart Nelson Arley Barksdale. The two were married Dec. 24, 1941 and later sealed for time and all eternity in The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints, Salt Lake City Temple. She was a loving and devoted companion, supporting him in his professional endeavors and his ecclesiastical callings. She will be laid to rest by his side, just as she lived.

Mrs. Barksdale is survived by six children and their respective spouses: Sharon and Ruben Connor, Nelson and Stefani Barksdale, Janice Erwin, Susie and Larry Johnson, Greg and Theresa Barksdale and Laree and Russ Smith.

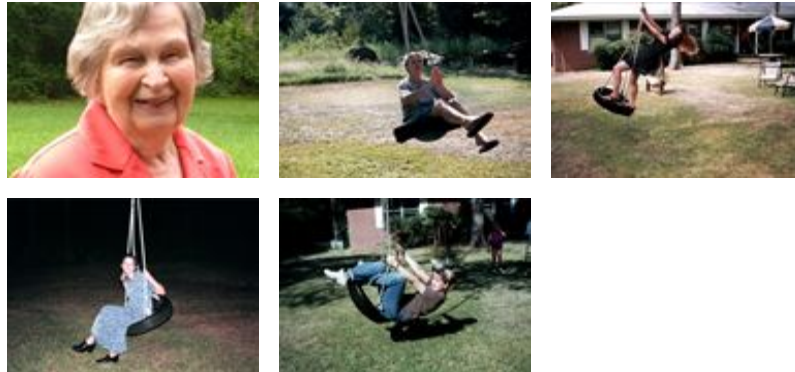
